

MINUTES OF THE FIRST MEETING OF CONSULTATIVE COMMITTEE OF COTTON ADVISORY BOARD HELD ON 24.10.2016 FOR THE COTTON SEASON 2016-17 IN THE CONFERENCE HALL OF OFFICE OF THE TEXTILE COMMISSIONER, MUMBAI-400 020.

1. The First meeting of Consultative Committee of Cotton Advisory Board (CAB) for the Cotton Season 2016-17 was held under the Chairpersonship of Dr. Kavita Gupta, Textile Commissioner on 24.10.2016 (Monday) at 11.00 AM in the Conference Hall of Office of the Textile Commissioner, Mumbai-20.

The list of participants of the meeting is at **Annexure-I**.

- 1.1 At the outset, the Chairperson extended a warm welcome to all the members. Shri Keshav Kumar, Director (Cotton), Govt. of India, Ministry of Textiles, New Delhi has also attended the meeting. The Chairperson informed that Consultative Committee is meeting first time in the current cotton season 2016-17.
- 1.2 The Chairperson, thereafter, requested Member Secretary (Officiating) to initiate the proceedings.

2. **AGENDA ITEM NO.1**

CONFIRMATION OF MINUTES OF THE THIRD MEETING OF CONSULTATIVE COMMITTEE OF CAB HELD ON 13.07.2016.

- 2.1 The Member Secretary (Officiating) informed that no comments were received from any of the members. Therefore, the Consultative Committee of CAB confirmed the Minutes of the Meeting held on 13.07.2016.

3. **AGENDA ITEM NO.2**

PROGRESS OF WORK OF SUB-COMMITTEES CONSTITUTED BY CAB

The Chairperson requested the Chairpersons of the Sub-Committees to brief on progress of work to the Consultative Committee.

- (a) Sub-Committee on prices: The members deliberated on the level of comfort which stakeholders have in getting acclimatised to the metric system. After detailed deliberations, the Consultative Committee decided that time being lint cotton prices in terms of both Rupees per quintal and Rupees per candy would be given in domestic transaction of cotton to enable stakeholders in getting acclimatised to the metric system.
- (b) Sub-Committee on pressed bale data and closing stock of cotton: The Director (Marketing), Cotton Corporation of India Ltd. (CCI), said that the compilation of pressed bale data and stocks of cotton from stakeholders scattered across the country is a difficult task and may require at least three months time to collate and compile such pressed bale data for cotton season 2015-16 and stocks of cotton as on 30.09.2016. The Chairperson requested CMD, CCI, the Chairperson of the Sub-Committee to submit its report on pressed bale data for cotton season 2015-16 and closing stock of cotton as on 30.09.2016 in the next meeting of Consultative Committee.
- (c) Sub-Committee on best practices in cotton cultivation: The Consultative Committee expressed the need for expeditious work of Sub-Committee on best practices in cotton cultivation and submission of its report. The Chairperson requested the Sub-Committee members to interact with each other and circulate the draft report within 10 days.

The Secretary General, Southern India Mills Association (SIMA) expressed the distinct need of second phase of Technology Mission on Cotton. In this regard, the Chairperson requested the Sub-Committee on best practices in cotton cultivation to prepare a concept note on second phase of Mini Mission – I (Generation of Cotton Research and Technology) and Mini Mission - II (Transfer of Technology and Development) of TMC. The Chairperson also requested CMD-CCI to prepare a concept note on second phase of Mini Mission - III (Development of Market Yards) and Mini Mission - IV (Modernisation and Up-gradation of Ginning and Pressing (G & P) Factories of TMC after due consultations and meeting with various stakeholders. The Chairperson requested them to submit the detailed note in the next meeting of Consultative Committee.

4. **AGENDA ITEM NO. 3**

PRICE TREND

4.1 **MINIMUM SUPPORT PRICE FOR 2016-17 COTTON SEASON:**

The Member Secretary (Officiating) apprised the members about announcement of the Minimum Support Price (MSP) for the Cotton season 2016-17 by the Government and fixation of MSP for other classes of seedcotton.

4.2 **Kapas price:**

The Member Secretary (Officiating) requested Director (Marketing), Cotton Corporation of India Ltd. (CCI), Navi Mumbai to brief about the Kapas prices for the current cotton season 2016-17.

The Director (Marketing), CCI Ltd. gave a brief review on the Kapas prices and informed that at present, average Kapas prices are ruling above MSP by 28% in Northern Zone and by 32-33% in Central Zone. While in Southern Zone Kapas prices are ruling by 10% above MSP level. He further informed that as on 20.10.2016, progressive Kapas arrivals for 2016-17 are reported at 9.55 lakh bales which are around 25.33% more than the arrivals (i.e. 7.62 lakh bales) during the same period last year.

4.3 **Cotton Lint Price:**

The Member Secretary (Officiating) requested President, Cotton Association of India (CAI) to brief about the lint prices prevailing in the current cotton season 2016-17.

The President, CAI informed that the cotton lint prices during the cotton season 2016-17 were higher than those of the cotton season 2015-16. He added that the monthly average prices during the period from 01.10.2016 to 22.10.2016 in case of Punjab, Haryana and Rajasthan growths (26 mm length, 3.5 – 4.9 micronaire) are higher by 6.89%, Maharashtra, Madhya Pradesh and Andhra Pradesh growths (28 mm length, 3.5 - 4.9 micronaire) are higher by 10.95 %, Gujarat growths (29 mm length, 3.5 - 4.9 micronaire) are higher by 14.64%, long staple growth (31mm length, 3.5 - 4.9 micronaire) are higher by 12.96% and DCH-32 growths (34 mm length, 3.0 - 3.8 micronaire) are higher by 8.48% respectively vis-a-vis average of seasonal price of 2015-16 cotton season.

He further informed that the increase in cotton prices is in the range of 6.89% to 14.64% during the period from 01.10.2016 to 22.10.2016 compared with the average of seasonal price of 2015-16 cotton season.

The Member-Secretary (Officiating) informed the Committee about the International Cotton Scenario as provided in the agenda circulated to all the members. In this backdrop, Shri B.K. Patodia, Past Chairman, Confederation of Indian Textile Industry and Chairman GTN Textiles Ltd. said that world over greater importance is laid down on stock to mill consumption ratio. The Cotton Balance Sheet drawn by Cotton Advisory Board in its meeting held on 13.07.2016 for the cotton season 2014-15 and 2015-16 reveals that the stock to mill consumption (Non – SSI + SSI) ratio at the end of cotton season 2014-15 and 2015-16 is 22% and 14% respectively which is low as compared to the world ending stock. With the low stock to mill consumption ratio, volatility in cotton prices is bound to happen. He said that world over, ending stock has never been less than 40% - 50% of the cotton consumption.

Shri Dhiren Sheth, President, CAI opined that the idea of creation of buffer stock will not only distort the market but will also unsettle other sectors of the cotton value chain.

After detailed deliberations, the Consultative Committee decided to recommend CAB to indicate stock to mill consumption (Non – SSI + SSI) ratio in Cotton Balance Sheet.

COTTON SEASON 2015-16

(i) **INPUTS ON ESTIMATION OF STATE-WISE AREA UNDER COTTON AND COTTON PRODUCTION FOR SEASON 2015-16 FOR CAB**

(a) **RECOMMENDATION FOR ESTIMATION OF STATE-WISE AREA UNDER COTTON CULTIVATION FOR COTTON SEASON 2015-16 TO CAB.**

As per the information made available by Joint Director, Directorate of Cotton Development (DOCD), Ministry of Agriculture, Government of India, the Area under Cotton Cultivation has been revised to 118.77 lakh hectares for the Cotton season 2015-16. The state-wise break up of area is as detailed below:

The state-wise production estimates are inclusive of loose Cotton.

The Mahalanobis National Crop Forecast Centre (MNCFC) conveyed that MNCFC generally generate two estimates. First production estimate through Satellite Mapping for 2016-17 will be available by 10th November and second estimate by 10th December, 2016.

(iii) INPUTS ON IMPORT, EXPORT AND CONSUMPTION OF COTTON FOR COTTON SEASON 2015-16 FOR CAB

(a) Input on estimation of Import and Export of cotton

The Directorate General of Commercial Intelligence and Statistics (DGCI & S), Kolkata has furnished the provisional data on Import and Export of Cotton from October, 2015 to August, 2016 as 14.68 lakh bales and 68.41 lakh bales respectively. As regards the export and import of cotton during the month of September, 2016, the President, CAI opined that the quantity of export of cotton in the month of September, 2016 was meager and import of cotton could be to the tune of 6 lakh bales respectively.

(b) Agency-wise input on estimation of Cotton Consumption

The Economics & Statistics Branch of Office of the Textile Commissioner has furnished the provisional month – wise consumption data for the eleven months i.e. October, 2015 – August, 2016 for Non-SSI units and SSI units as 249.47 lakh bales and 24.83 lakh bales respectively.

(iv) INPUTS ON IMPORT, EXPORT AND CONSUMPTION OF COTTON FOR CURRENT COTTON SEASON 2016-17 FOR CAB

(a) Agency-wise input on estimation of Import and Export of cotton

The President, CAI opined that the export of cotton for the cotton season 2016-17 would be around 50 - 55 lakh bales and Import of cotton would be around 17 lakh bales respectively.

(b) Agency-wise input on estimation of Cotton Consumption

The Secretary General, Southern India Mills Association (SIMA) opined that the Cotton consumption for 2016-17 for Non-SSI and SSI units would be around 310 lakh bales.

6. AGENDA ITEM NO. 5

ANY OTHER MATTER

Shri Sanjay Jain, President, Northern India Textile Mills' Association said that DGFT/DGCI&S's data on import and export of cotton is available only after a long delay and there is time lag of around 60 days and opined that with modern communication system it is not difficult to get the data on a day to day basis which would help the ginners, spinning mills and the Government to assess the cotton situation precisely. He urged that DGFT/ DGCI&S may be encouraged to make available the data on import and export of cotton at the earliest. The Chairperson said that the matter will suitably be taken up with DGCI&S, Kolkata to provide the data on import and export of cotton by every 10th of following month.

Shri Arun Sekhsaria, Managing Director, DD Cotton Private Ltd., expressed that in the next Consultative Committee meeting every agency may present methodology adopted by their organization in deriving the production, consumption, import and export estimates. The Chairperson requested agencies concern to send a brief note on the methodology adopted by their organization, prior to the next Consultative Committee meeting and also to make detailed presentation in the next meeting of the Consultative Committee on the same.

Shri Arun Sekhsaria, Managing Director, DD Cotton Private Ltd., and President, CAI suggested that the format of Office of the Textile Commissioner for monthly statistical return (M02) may be modified to capture the information on consumption of cotton waste also. The Chairperson said that the matter will be examined by the Textile Commissioner and the same will be discussed in the next CAB meeting.

The meeting, thereafter, ended with a vote of thanks to the Chair.
