

**Minutes of the 3<sup>rd</sup> meeting of the  
Technical Advisory –Cum - Monitoring Committee ( TAMC) of Revised Restructured  
TUFS(RRTUFS) held on 19<sup>th</sup> June, 2014 at 3.00 pm.**

The 3<sup>rd</sup> meeting of the TAMC on Revised Restructured TUFS was convened on 19<sup>th</sup> June, 2014 under the Chairpersonship of the Textile Commissioner in the Conference Hall of the Office of the Textile Commissioner, Mumbai . The list of participants is at **Annex-I**.

2. The Textile Commissioner & Chairman, TAMC welcomed the members of the TAMC and asked member secretary to take up the agenda for discussion. Thereafter the agenda points were discussed and following decisions were taken.

**Agenda No.1. : Action taken report on the decisions of the Second meeting of TAMC on RRTUFS.**

3. The Member Secretary apprised the TAMC about the action taken on the decisions taken by the TAMC in its 2<sup>nd</sup> meeting held on 19 /03/2014. Since no comments on the minutes of the 2<sup>nd</sup> meeting was received, the minutes is taken as confirmed.

**Agenda No.2.: Progress of release subsidy and utilisation of fund:**

**(a) Progress of release subsidy and utilisation of fund:**

4. The Member Secretary briefed the members about the progress of release of subsidy under MTUFS & RTUFS. He informed that claims for quarter ended upto December, 2013 are pending for release with MoT and the claims for quarter March, 2014 are under process, in the O/o TXC.

**(b) Progress of RR-TUFS:**

5. The Member Secretary also briefed the Committee about the progress of issuance of UIDs under RR-TUFS as on 26.05.2014. Further he informed the members that an online system for issuance of UIDs under RR-TUFS has been introduced in which an interface has been provided to the individual beneficiary to access the status of their cases by using TUF Reference number & PAN Number.

6. Shri V.K.Ladia of CITI raised the concern of the industry regarding delay in receipt of subsidies under TUFS . He informed the Committee that due to this industry is finding it difficult to repay the instalments of term loan .He also referred to left out cases of List I of MTUFS by the Banks for which information was collected and requested that scrutiny of these cases may be expedited. He further desired that representative of industry may also be associated for scrutiny.

7. The Chairperson informed that the matter for release of sanction of TUFS subsidy is under consideration of the Ministry. Further, the Chairperson stressed that the Banks/ lending agencies should strengthen their TUFS Cell to avoid discrepancies/delay. In this connection Textile Commissioner informed that a comprehensive computerised system is being planned to cover the entire activities of TUFS which could help in resolving many issues including that of left-out cases and delay in submission. Textile Commissioner further authorised the three Sub-Committees constituted for scrutinising the revised committed liabilities of the List-II cases under the chairmanship of the Joint Textile Commissioners of the O/o Textile Commissioner to take up the scrutiny of the left out cases of List-I (numbering about 303)

in which the subsidy under TUFS was paid during the 11th plan period but left out in 12th plan period as the concerned lending agencies have omitted liabilities of such on-going accounts while furnishing the account-wise quarter-wise committed liability for 12th plan period.

**Agenda No.3: Discussion on the Report of the 1<sup>st</sup> Sub-Committee constituted in the 1<sup>st</sup> meeting of the TAMC for-Speed specification indicated at Annexure MC-11 of GR (Annexure-I) for brand new shuttleless looms:**

8. The Committee deliberated on the Report of the Sub-committee and decided to keep the speed specification of rapier shuttle less loom at 380 MPM weft insertion rate for the use by decentralized power loom weaving industry.

**Agenda No.4.: Discussion on the Report of the 2nd Sub-Committee constituted in the 1<sup>ST</sup> meeting of the TAMC to recommend speed specification in respect of items of machinery of shuttleless looms for 100% Jute Weaving for coverage under TUFS benefits:**

9. The Committee deliberated on the Report of the Sub-committee and decided that speed specification in respect of shuttleless looms for 100% Jute Weaving may be kept at 450 MPM weft insertion rate.

**Agenda No. 5: Discussion on the Report of the 3<sup>rd</sup> Sub-Committee constituted in the 1<sup>ST</sup> meeting of TAMC for modification/deletion of the machineries regarding technical textiles under RR-TUFS:**

10. The Committee deliberated on the Report of the Sub-committee and accepted the recommendations of the Sub-committee with certain modifications as given in **Annex-II**

**Agenda No. 6 Representation for Relaxing the norm of counter sign of Chartered Engineer's Certificate by the Indian Embassy in respect of imported machineries prior to the issue of GR on RRTUFS .**

11. The matter was discussed and the TAMC was of the unanimous view that the provision 3.2(3) in Part III of the GR on RRTUFS may be made with prospective effect, i.e from the date of issue of the GR on RRTUFS. Accordingly TAMC decided to recommend the same to IMSC for suitable modification/clarification in the existing GR for RR-TUFS.

**Agenda No.7:** Any other matter with the permission of the Chair.

12. **Additional Agenda No.1:** With the permission of the Chair, agenda item relating to the representations received from lending agencies for extending the time limit of one year from the date of sanction of term loan for submission of applications for UID was taken up. This was based on the representation received from SBI and PNB wherein they had submitted that a few cases wherein the last date was 31.02.2014 could not be submitted in time.

13. The Committee deliberated on the issue and felt that one year time limit granted as per the GR is sufficient and therefore decided not to consider such request for extension of time.

14. **Additional Agenda No.2:** Shri. Divakar A Bhat, Asstt. Director Central Silk Board Bangalore, special invitee, requested for considering of a special package for silk weaving sector under TUFS . The Chairperson informed that the existing scheme already provides interest subsidy and capital subsidy benefit for the silk sector. The scheme is uniformly applicable across the all regions hence region-wise

modification can not be suggested under the scheme. The Chairperson however advised the Cenral Silk Board to come with proposal for inclusion of more machine used in silk sector for the benefit under TUFs.

The meeting concluded with vote of thanks to the Chair.
