Northern India Textile Mills' Association (NITMA) is an association of Textile Mills located in Northern India and was established in the year 23<sup>rd</sup> May 1958. It is registered under Societies Act XX1 of 1860 and is a non-profit body solely engaged in helping promote the interest of India's Textile Industry holistically; not only in the northern part as the name suggests but also having members from various States like Gujarat, Maharashtra, Jammu &Kashmir, Punjab, Haryana, Rajasthan, Himachal Pradesh, Delhi, U.P., Madhya Pradesh, Uttrakhand and Chhattisgarh. NITMA is a 63 years young Organization, with the objective to promote and protect the economic interests in relation to production, sales, trade and commerce of textile and textile manufacturers. NITMA has been taking up the issues and concerns of its constituent member units effectively with all stakeholders viz. the GST Council, RBI, Niti Aayog etc. and all nodal departments of the Government both at the Central and State levels.

The Northern India Textile Mills Association (NITMA), a non-profit registered society, was established in 1956 specially to service the promotional needs of textile & textiles machinery manufacturers. All new membership should come from NITMA's assigned territory viz J&K, Punjab, Himachal Pradesh, Haryana, or from companies whose registered or corporate offices are in the Northern Region irrespective of the location of their plant. Uttrakhand, Chattisgarh, UP, Gujarat, Maharashtra etc. which are not included so far in NITMA assigned territory shall stand included in NITMA's assigned territory henceforth.

Recognizing the quality and effective coverage of its wide range of services, there was a demand that it should enlarge the scope of its membership to include Associate members without voting rights and enrolled them irrespective of their location from area like: cotton merchants, ginners, machinery suppliers / manufacturers, dyes and chemicals suppliers, consultants & Readymade Garments & made up units. NITMA being the service organization is engaged in promoting and protect the interest of its members in its interface with Government and its agencies at various levels and takes up issues which need to be addressed through Government intervention, as follows:

- Projecting in target markets the performance and potential of its member units through various media.
- To organize Seminars, Workshops, Conferences and meetings with various State and Central Government authorities.
- Sponsoring outgoing textile and other related interest of members in trade, economic and commercial relations with other countries.
- Convening meetings on policy level issues related to central and state levels, to provide an opportunity to its constituent members to review, discuss and wherever necessary, to formulate recommendations to the Government and other authorities.
- Executing projects and responsibilities entrusted to it from time to time, by various agencies like CITI-CDRA, NITRA etc. and servicing as a forum for two way transmission of views and information between Government Departments both at the Central and State levels.
- Organizing Training and Orientation Programmes for its Constituents members on Foreign Trade policy and Procedures, and Rules and Procedures of Customs and Excise and other subjects related to exports.

# **Data & Statistics**



#### COTTON

The first Meeting of Consultative Committee of Cotton Advisory Board (CAB) for the Cotton Season 2019-20 was held under the Chairmanship of the Textile Commissioner on 28.11.2019 at 11.30 A.M in the Conference Hall of Office of the Textile Commissioner, Mumbai-20.

## **Kapas Price:**

The CMD, Cotton Corporation of India Ltd. (CCI) gave a brief review on the kapas prices and informed that average opening prices of kapas for cotton season 2019-20, were ruling marginally above as compared to avg opening prices of previous year. She added that since the beginning of current cotton season , avg kapas prices of Fair Average Quality (FAQ) grade kapas were hovering at MSP level initially in northern states with preponement of the season, in all the major cotton growing states, as a result , CCI started MSP operations w.e.f 01.10.2019 procured around 1.34 I lakh bales upto 20.11.2019 under MSP operation.

She further informed that as on 20.1.2019, progressive kapas arrivals for 2019-20 are reported at 31.29 lakh bales, which are around 2.52% lower than the arrivals (i.e., 32.10 lakh bales) during the corresponding period last year.

#### **Cotton Lint Price:**

The President, Cotton Association of India (CAI) informed that the cotton lint prices during cotton season 2019-20 were lower than those of the cotton season 2018-19. He added that the monthly average prices during the period from 01.10.2019 to 20.11.2019 in case of Gujarat growth (29 mm length, 3.5 – 4.9 micronaire) lower by 12.11%, long staple growth (31mm length, 3.5 - 4.9 micronaire) lower by 10.02% and DCH-32 growths (34 mm length, 3.0 - 3.8 micronaire) lower by 8.42% respectively vis-à-vis those prevailing during the same period last year.

He further informed that seasonal average cotton price decreased within the range of 8.36% to 11.52% from 1.10.2019 to 20.11.2019 compared to the corresponding average prices for the said months during 2018-19 cotton season.

After detailed deliberations, the sub – committee of CAB decided to award the survey work as under:

## (b) Input on estimation of Cotton Consumption

The Economics & Statistics Branch of Office of the Textile Commissioner has furnished the final consumption data for Non-SSI units and SSI units as 274.50 lakh bales and 25.00 lakh bales respectively for the cotton season 2018-19.

## (a) Agency-wise input on estimation of Import and Export of Cotton

The president, CAI opined that the export of cotton for the cotton season 2019-20 would be around 42 lakh bales & import of cotton in the range of 25 lakh bales respectively.

The Past Chairman, CITI opined that export of cotton for the cotton season 2019-20 would be around 50 lakh bales and import of cotton around 15-20 lakh bales respectively.

## (b) Agency-wise input on estimation of Cotton Consumption

The Past Chairman, CITI opined that cotton consumption for 2019-20 for Non-SSI units and SSI units would be around 285 lakh bales and 30 lakh bales respectively.

The president, CAI opined that the consumption of cotton for 2019-20 for Non-SSI units and SSI units would be around 288 lakh bales and 25 lakh bales respectively.

## **Cotton Textiles Export Update for (August 2020)**

- As per the data released by the Ministry of Commerce, Cotton Textile exports reached a level of USD 991.40 million in August 2020 recording a growth of 13.6 per cent against the corresponding month of August 2019, wherein exports were valued at USD 872.66 million.
- Cotton yarn exports in August 2020 have recorded a growth of 17.7 per cent, and cotton madeup exports have recorded a growth of 11.3 per cent. Exports of Cotton Fabrics have declined by (-) 12 per cent.
- India's raw cotton fibre exports grew by 216.4 per cent during the period August 2020.

## **Cotton Textiles Export Update for (April-August 2020)**

Cotton Textile exports reached a level of USD 3,509.46 million during April - August 2020 marking a decline of (-) 21.1 per cent against the corresponding period of April - August 2019, wherein exports were valued at USD 4,446.96 million.

- i. para no. 1 of the Notes to Accounts of the Financial Statement regarding an amount of Rs.2,23,693/- paid by NITMA in the month of May 2019 to GST Consultant to deposit the GST liabilities of NITMA however, the Consultant had not deposited Rs.1,80,000/- till date and he had requested for one month time to deposit the same with all interest & penalties caused due to non-deposits by him.
- ii. para no 4 of the Notes to Accounts of the Financial Statement regarding merger of the account balances of "NITMA PB Committee Fund" including in-operative bank balance of such Fund of Rs.30,676/- with NITMA accounts.

Our report is not modified in respect of the above matters.

#### **Responsibilities of Management for the Financial Statements:**

#### **Significant Accounting Policies and Notes to Accounts**

#### A. Significant Accounting Policies:

- a) The Accounts of the Association are maintained on accrual basis except membership subscription which are accounted for on cash basis.
- b) Fixed Assets are stated at historical cost less Accumulated depreciation.
- c) Depreciation on Fixed Assets is charged as rates are prescribed.
- d) The Admission Fee received from the new Members is credited to "Corpus"
- e) All Investments are in Fixed Deposits with Bank and are stated at cost inclusive of interest accrued.

#### **B.** Notes to Accounts:

1. NITMA had paid an amount of Rs. 2,23,693 to GST Consultant M/S Rajesh Mehra & Associates, CA on 10.05.2019 through an account payee cheque drawn on IDBI Bank for the deposit of GST Liability for the month of April, 2019 of NITMA. However, on finding of the Statutory Auditor it was revealed that since May 2019 to till date, the consultant has not deposited Rs. 1,80,000/- out of the above amount.

Further it was also pointed out by the Statutory Auditors that GST Consultant had taken the Input credit of parties (Ace Agencies & Everest Agencies) with whom NITMA had never made any transaction.

The management has taken the above matter with the GST Consultant, and consultant has been requested for one month time for the deposit of the above GST liability of NITMA along with penalty and interests (including interest of Rs. 29700/- upto March 2020 and balance till date of payments) arise on NITMA due to him.

## 2. Retirement Benefits:

a. Provision for Gratuity made was as per the provisions of Payments of Gratuity Act, 1972;



- b. Provision of Leave Entitlement made was on the basis of prorata of unutilized of 10 days entitlement.
- 3. Certain Receivables & Payables including TDS/GST are subject to Confirmations/ Reconciliations.
- 4. Accounts of a Fund maintained separately in the name of "Nitma PB Committee Fund" has been incorporated by NITMA in its accounts by debiting bank account for Rs.1,66,693/- and balance of Rs. 30,676/- as inoperative saving bank account and by corresponding credits of Rs. 1,97,379/- to Corpus Fund.
- 5. Previous year figure have been regrouped / rearranged wherever considered necessary.
