

MINUTES OF THE FIRST MEETING OF CONSULTATIVE COMMITTEE OF COTTON ADVISORY BOARD HELD ON 28.11.2019 FOR THE COTTON SEASON 2019-20 IN THE CONFERENCE HALL OF OFFICE OF THE TEXTILE COMMISSIONER, MUMBAI-400 020.

1. The First Meeting of Consultative Committee of Cotton Advisory Board (CAB) for the Cotton Season 2019-20 was held under the Chairmanship of Shri Moloy Chandan Chakraborty, Textile Commissioner on 28.11.2019 (Thursday) at 11.30 AM in the Conference Hall of Office of the Textile Commissioner, Mumbai-20.

The list of participants of the meeting is at **Annexure-I**.

- 1.1 At the outset, the Chairman extended a warm welcome to all the members. Shri J.K.Dora, Under Secretary (Cotton), Ministry of Textiles, Govt. of India, New Delhi, has also attended the meeting. The Chairman informed that Consultative Committee is meeting first time in the current cotton season 2019-20.

- 1.2 Thereafter, the Chairman initiated agenda for discussion.

2. **AGENDA ITEM NO.1**

CONFIRMATION OF MINUTES OF THE SECOND MEETING OF CONSULTATIVE COMMITTEE OF CAB HELD ON 18.06.2019.

- 2.1 It was informed that no comments were received from any of the members. Therefore, the Consultative Committee of CAB confirmed the Minutes of the Meeting held on 18.06.2019.

3. **AGENDA ITEM NO.2**

PRICE TREND

- 3.1 **MINIMUM SUPPORT PRICE FOR 2019-20 COTTON SEASON:**

It was apprised to the members about announcement of the Minimum Support Price (MSP) for the cotton season 2019-20 by the Government and fixation of MSP for other classes of seed cotton.

- 3.2 **Kapas price:**

CMD, the Cotton Corporation of India Ltd. (CCI) gave a brief review on the kapas prices and informed that average opening prices of kapas for cotton season 2019-20 were ruling marginally above as compared to average opening prices of previous year. She added that since beginning of current cotton season, average kapas prices of FAQ grade kapas were hovering at MSP level initially in northern states with the preponement of the season, in all the major cotton growing states. As a result, CCI started MSP operations w.e.f. 1.10.2019 and procured around 1.34 lakh bales up to 20.11.2019 under MSP operations.

She further informed that as on 20.11.2019, progressive kapas arrivals for 2019-20 were reported at 31.29 lakh bales, which are around 2.52% lower than the arrivals (i.e. 32.10 lakh bales) during the corresponding period last year.



3.3 Cotton Lint Price:

The President, CAI informed that the cotton lint prices during cotton season 2019-20 were lower than those of the cotton season 2018-19. He added that the monthly average prices during the period from 01.10.2019 to 20.11.2019 in case of Gujarat growth (29 mm length, 3.5 - 4.9 micronaire) lower by 12.11%, long staple growth (31mm length, 3.5 - 4.9 micronaire) lower by 10.02% and DCH-32 growth (34 mm length, 3.0 - 3.8 micronaire) lower by 8.42% respectively vis-a-vis those prevailing during the same period last year.

He further informed that the seasonal average cotton price decreased within the range of 8.36% to 11.52% from 01.10.2019 to 20.11.2019 compared to the corresponding average price for the said months during 2018-19 cotton season.

The Consultative Committee took a note of the International Cotton Scenario as provided in the agenda.

4. AGENDA ITEM NO.3

DISCUSSION ON SURVEY OF ESTIMATION OF CONSUMPTION OF COTTON IN NON-MILL/ NON-SSI UNITS AND IN NON-TEXTILE USAGE

On 10.10.2019, in the Sub-Committee of CAB, the proposed survey has been discussed at length and CMD, CCI informed that they have vast network in concerned cotton producing states and they will collect the data on loose cotton from the ginning and pressing units & will furnish the same to ATIRA for incorporating in the final loose cotton survey report to be prepared by ATIRA. Further, ATIRA will collect data from Non-Mill sector and other sectors & submit the analysis report. After detailed deliberations, the Sub Committee of CAB had decided to award the survey work as under:-

The cost of survey now will be Rs.10 lakh and the expenditure of Rs. 10 lakhs will equally borne by CAI and CITI.

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The Sub-Committee decided that ATIRA will circulate the Questionnaire drawn by them to the office of the Textile Commissioner, CCI, CITI and CAI for due modifications and finalisation of the same.

The Consultative Committee noted the development and decision taken by Sub-Committee of CAB in respect of Loose Cotton Survey and advised to complete the work in the stipulated time period.

(a) RECOMMENDATION FOR REVISION OF STATE-WISE AREA UNDER COTTON CULTIVATION FOR COTTON SEASON 2018-19 TO CAB.

As per the information on 4th advance estimate made available by the Director, Directorate of Cotton Development (DCD), Ministry of Agriculture, Government of India, the area under cotton cultivation has been revised to 126.58 lakh hectares for the cotton season 2018-19. 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(iii) INPUTS ON IMPORT, EXPORT AND CONSUMPTION OF COTTON FOR COTTON SEASON 2018-19 FOR CAB

(a) Input on estimation of Import and Export of cotton

The Directorate General of Commercial Intelligence and Statistics (DGCI & S), Kolkata has furnished the provisional data on Import and Export of Cotton from October, 2018 to August, 2019 as 29.93 lakh bales and 42.84 lakh bales respectively.

(b) Input on estimation of Cotton Consumption

The Economics & Statistics Branch of Office of the Textile Commissioner has furnished the provisional consumption data for Non-SSI units and SSI units as 274.50 lakh bales and 25.00 lakh bales respectively for the cotton season 2018-19.

(iv) INPUTS ON IMPORT, EXPORT AND CONSUMPTION OF COTTON FOR CURRENT COTTON SEASON 2019-20 FOR CAB

(a) Agency-wise input on estimation of Import and Export of cotton

The President, CAI opined that the export of cotton for the cotton season 2019-20 would be around 42 lakh bales and Import of cotton in the range of 25 lakh bales respectively.

The Past Chairman, CITI opined that the export of cotton for the cotton season 2019-20 would be around 50 lakh bales and Import of cotton around 15-20 lakh bales respectively.

(b) Agency-wise input on estimation of Cotton Consumption

The Past Chairman, CITI opined that the cotton consumption for 2019-20 for Non-SSI units and SSI units would be around 285 lakh bales and 30 lakh bales respectively.

The President, CAI opined that the cotton consumption for 2019-20 for Non-SSI units and SSI units would be around 288 lakh bales and 25 lakh bales respectively.

6. AGENDA ITEM NO. 5

DISCUSSION ON THE DRAFT PROPOSAL OF NIRMAL COTTON MISSION

Ministry of Textiles has forwarded a draft copy of Nirmal Cotton Mission (NCM) prepared by Cotton Corporation of India (CCI) for examination in view of PMO direction's for preparation of vision 2024 documents. Most of the components of NCM are same as per TMC-II proposal.

Meeting of the Committee constituted under the Chairmanship of CMD, CCI to review the Technology Mission on Cotton (TMC) - Phase-II was held on 05.11.2019 and 13.11.2019 to discuss on Nirmal Cotton Mission.

The draft proposal on NCM was placed before the Consultative Committee. The CMD, CCI and Chairman of Committee to review the TMC - Phase-II has explained the objective, outcome and budgetary provision of Nirmal Cotton Mission which is as under:

A. Objective:

- i) To produce Intrinsically pure cotton bales having following attributes:
 - a. Trash-content and contaminants at international level.
 - b. Optimum moisture with quality labelling and traceability.
 - c. Devoid of admixture of different staples.
- ii) To move towards a “sustainable cotton” eco-system ensuring quality based pricing for both farmers and processors and also competitiveness in international markets.

B. Expected Outcome:

- Farmers identified by the Kisan club would have been trained to produce contaminant-controlled, admixture free seed cotton at farm level.
- Selected manpower from 250 G&P units would have been trained to efficiently run the machines to produce contaminant-controlled, pure clean cotton bales.
- 250 G&P units would have been accredited as per ISO 9001:2015 Quality Management System for production of quality cotton and would have acquired the necessary facilities for processing contaminant-controlled, pure cotton bales.
- 150 HVI units would have been installed in selected Government Institutions.
- 125 lakh bales (contaminant controlled) of Indian cotton produced by targeted 250 G&P units would have been RFID-tagged, tested and labelled for quality parameters to ensure classification and traceability.
- Indian cotton would have established its’ name as a premium cotton at international level.

C. Budgetary Provision:

A total budgetary provision of Rs.365.35 crores has been proposed for five years (2020-21 to 2024-25) is as under:
